Excerpts from an MLK sermon

The annual service to honor the late Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was held on Monday, January 19th at the United Methodist Church in New Canaan. The memorial event is organized by the Interfaith Council of New Canaan and involves members of our local clergy and town government. We captured a few excerpts from our two ABC House seniors, Osaze Wilson and Kwaku Gyasi, as they spoke and offered their reflections on the day.

"I understand this is a service to commemorate Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. but I would like to focus on a theory rather than the man. This theory is one that Dr. King put into practice through his message and benevolence. Hate, we know, is a natural human emotion. I like to call it Love's evil cousin. Hate can be characterized as an organization of aggressive impulses directed to a person or group of people. It is composed of habitual bitter feeling and accusatory thought. It's not a long shot for hate to also be considered extra punitive; the hater feels justified in his emotion because of the action of the hated...Overcoming this takes work, takes watchfulness, takes a willingness to be exposed and uncom-

fortable all in the name of setting things right. Martin Luther King Jr. understood that this (doctrine of hate) could be reversed. Just as hate ends in prejudice; King saw that another natural human emotion, love when coupled with tolerance, creates a more powerful opposing force to racism. It becomes: Equality."social relations with others difficult.
