Set upon the hill, 64 Locust Avenue represents the aspirations of young men hungry for a better future. It is the home of the A Better Chance Program of New Canaan. Since 1974, this house has been called "home" by over 75 young minority men who have had the privilege and opportunity to attend New Canaan High School. Many of our young scholars come from New York City, New Haven, Boston and Philadelphia, but all come from academically underserved communities, and are seeking a high school program that prepares them for college and leadership roles in their futures.

The results of the program are measureable. Since it's inception, all 75 young men have received their high school diploma, attended college and some have gone on to graduate school. ABC Alumni have gone on to have professional careers in law, business, technology, communications, education and non-profit programs. Our scholars gain not only a great education, but also the incredible experiences of living with host families and becoming apart of this community, developing relationships that last a lifetime. They enrich our lives with their unique perspectives, varied life experiences and wonderful charm.

The investment that we make to sponsor our scholars covers expenses similar to those you have in your home including food, heating, insurance and general maintenance of a 100 year old home! The ABC program is 100% dependent on private donations from New Canaan citizens, town organizations and churches. Our annual operating budget of \$220,000 is entirely funded by local friends and supporters like you. We receive neither government funding nor any financial support from our national organization.

A Better Chance is one of the many reasons we call New Canaan "The Next Station To Heaven". Our community cares and understands the importance of a great education and the difference it can make in someone's life. I hope you will consider making a donation to our Annual Appeal so we can continue to offer this life changing opportunity to these deserving and hard-working young men.


